Chernobyl Children's Life Line (CCLL)

Supplying much needed support for families and children in war-torn Ukraine and for Ukrainian refugees in Poland



The Footprints Project



A Dorset charity bringing a sense of community, hope and increased self-worth to socially excluded people, reducing reoffending and building stronger communities by assisting exoffenders both before and after release.

CCLL Sherborne and Yeovil Branch

Chernobyl Children's Life Line supports families and children still affected by the Chernobyl nuclear disaster in Ukraine 37 years ago. The health effects persist, affecting second and third generations of those first exposed. These people are also deeply affected by the Ukraine war, which has caused fires and disturbed the soils around Chernobyl releasing more radioactivity. Local people, desperate for food and warmth, are growing their own produce and burning local wood, all of which is contaminated and exposes them to further risk. CCLL nationally, working with a Ukrainian Charity, Eleon, provides a wide range of support, including sending vital supplies to Ukraine, arranging long-term care for disabled children, and support for Ukrainian refugees in Poland.



Sherborne and Yeovil Branch are fundraising this year to support Ukrainian children's mental health, especially in Borodyanka, north of Kiev, where the local school has been totally destroyed. We are providing text and exercise books and also lamps, power packs, crafts and games to install in air raid shelters which are dark and damp. We hope to make school as normal as possible and that this will prove a distraction for the children from the sound of bombs exploding around them.

Our work includes helping evacuate disabled people, children and young people to evacuate to Poland, where there a massive under resourcing for the 4 million refugees (10% of the Polish population). We have provided relief breaks in Poland for 150 children.

In the past you supported us when we welcomed Ukrainian children from Borodyanka to Yeovil, Sherborne and the surrounding area, but now all our efforts are focused on supporting families nearer to their home region. Your donations will go directly to support our relief work especially in Borodyanka.

Footprints Project



We train volunteers in the community to provide person-centred support for people who have been in prison, have received a community sentence or a caution from the Police, enabling them to lead purposeful, fulfilling lives, contributing positively to the local community.

Many ex-prisoners are people who have grown up in care, suffered abuse in childhood, or have no formal qualifications and 70% were unemployed before going into custody. 1 in 6 are homeless. Without support, a majority will reoffend within twelve months.

We help by providing a mentor to support each person in prison within Dorset and who are preparing to return to the local area. Based on their individual needs we give them help with housing, education training and employment, mental and physical health, substance abuse and family, helping them to reintegrate into society. Most of all we give hope and respect.

We meet our clients at the prison gate and transport them to where they need to be and then provide on-going support. Face-to-face and by phone - and this is for as long as they need it. We offer tailored support for women also, with the additional challenges that they can face.
